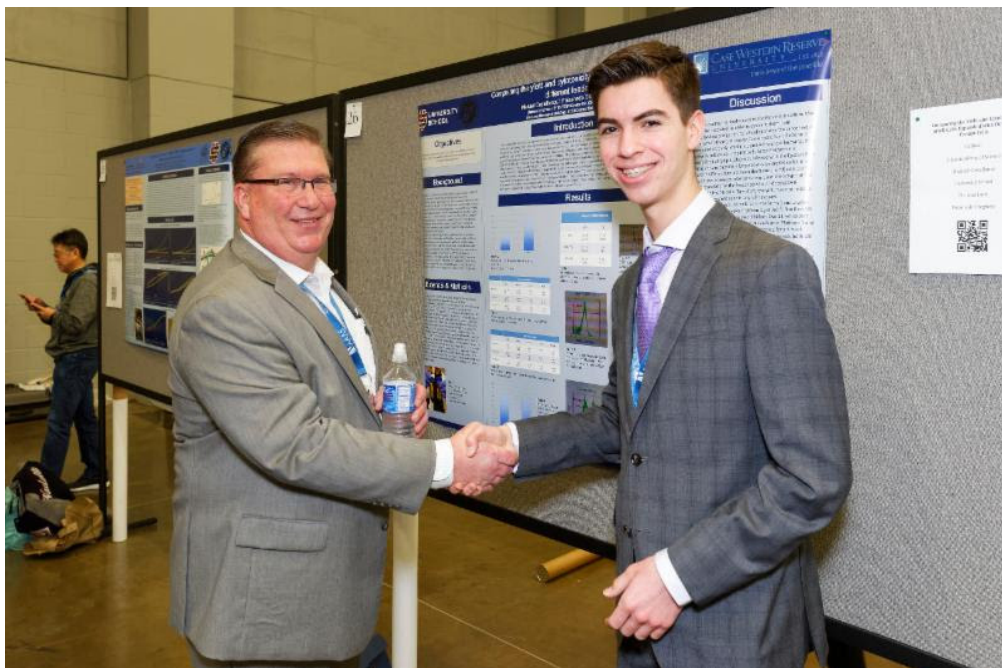

Approximately 100 students in grades 9-12 will have the opportunity to compete for 5 project spots that advance to the International Science and Engineering Fair held in Pittsburgh, PA May 13-18.

At the ISEF, more than 1,700 students from 70 countries will compete for \$4,000,000 in awards and scholarships.

This year's BSEF will require approximately 50 judges that cover a wide range of scientific and engineering categories. Please lend your expertise and judge this year's projects and help evaluate the 5 most deserving projects.
